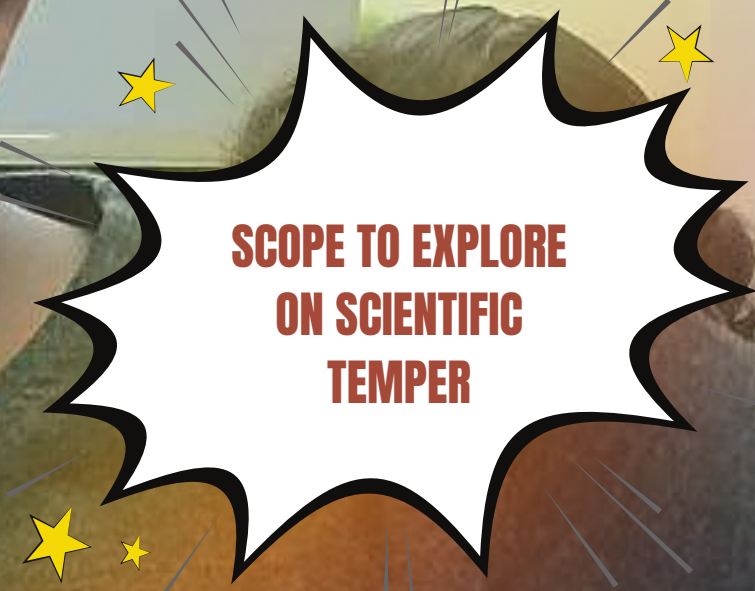

Kartikeya Class X and Harini Class VI had exposure to insect olfaction-related work in Dr.Kesavan Subaharan's Veterinary Entomology laboratory, ICAR - National Bureau of Agricultural Insect Resources, Yelahanka campus, from April 24th to 28th 2023. During their internship program, students spent time culturing insects for experiments, Identifying various bio stages of insects, and Identifying compounds that are toxic to insects. Students were excited to see the world of insects both beneficial and harmful and ecologically safe strategies adopted to manage them. They tried learning clean and green technologies in pest management.





Hithesh Karnam Class X and Harshika Adapala Class X took part in the Summer School of Practical Electronics, organized by the Electronics and Engineering group of Raman Research Institute, Bangalore, from 19th April to 19th May 2023.

Children attended lectures - demonstrations given by Professors of various departments. In practical sessions students learned about semiconductors, making PCB, to construct different types of circuits with PCBs and Breadboards. They were also exposed to simple projects in Arduino.

Children shared their experiences with their classmates by compiling their work in the form of PPT.

Field trip - SLR GreenTech

Educational visits provide excellent opportunities for students to interact with laboratory industries. This kind of exposure to environments outside school, would benefit students to get an understanding of the different sectors, fields and opportunities to contribute. One such experience VVP provided to its students is the visit to SLR GREEN TECH, a super facility plant tissue culture R&D lab in Devanahalli.

17 students from Grade 8 along with Ms. R Ramya Janakiraman visited this facility. Mr. Arun, one of the faculties at the facility was available to help the students around, guide them and give a briefing of what happens there.

Students were helped to understand the importance of Good Laboratory Practice (GLP), description of optimal working/laboratory area housekeeping, SOP, material handling and waste management practices of the laboratory. The objective of the lab is to drive the biotechnology business in the field of production and commercialization of biologics/biosimilar products for national interest. Students showed active participation and interest in learning the new technique in agriculture.

Design thinking originally came about as a way of teaching engineers how to approach problems creatively, like designers do. Here we aim to design experts in our school.

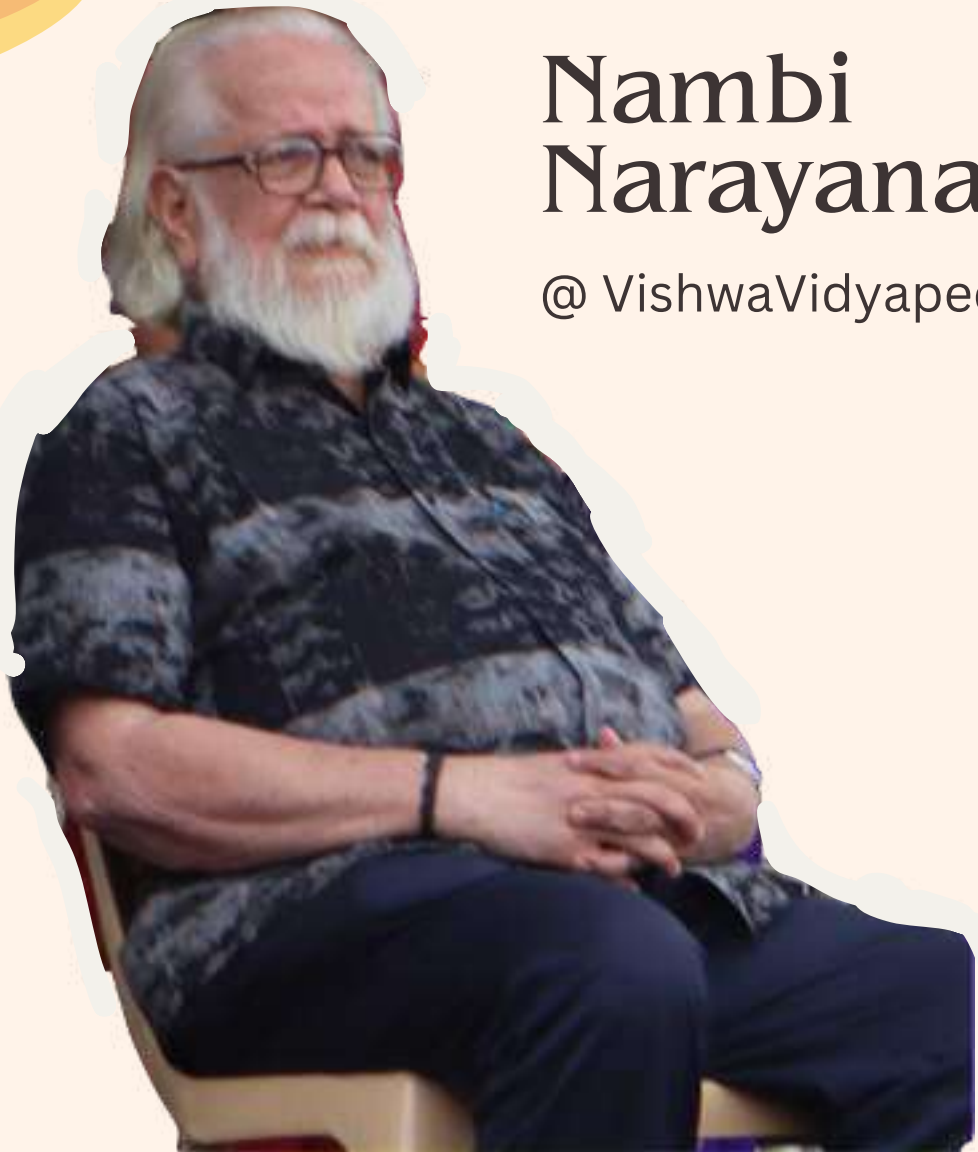

BECOMING NO.1 IS EASIER THAN REMAINING NO.1

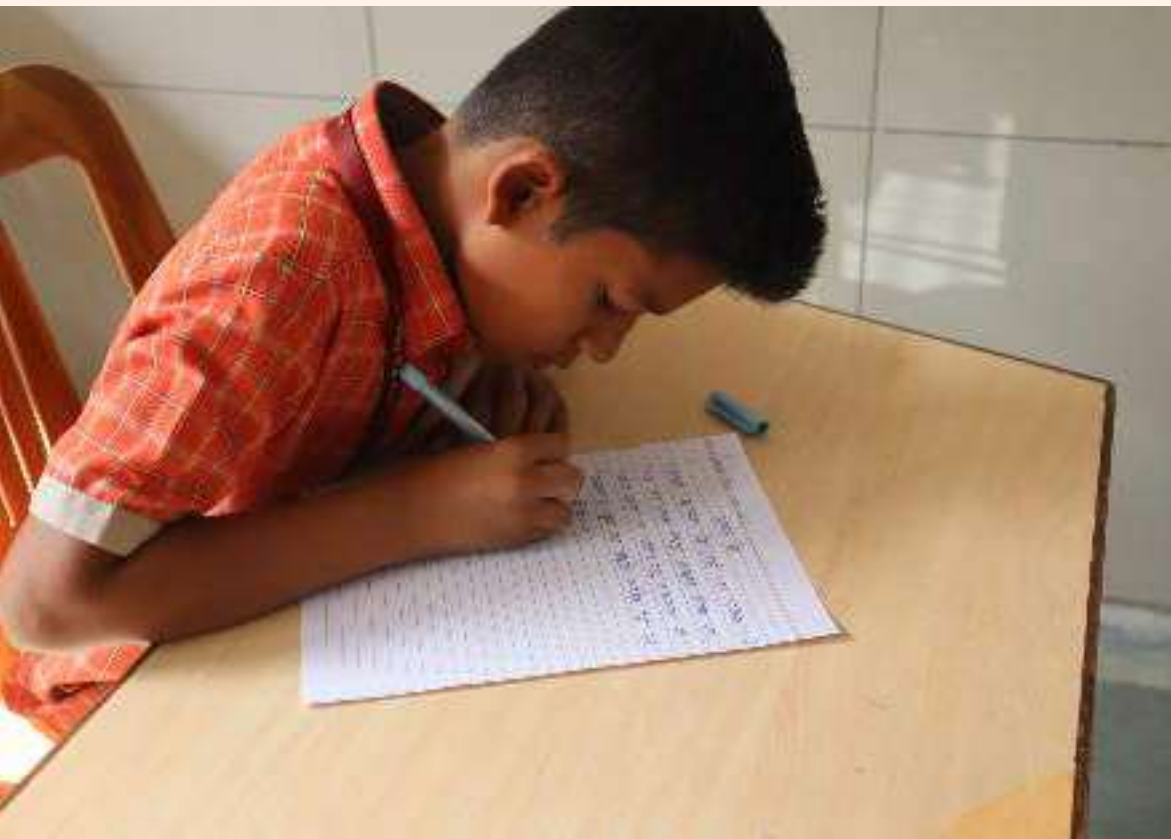

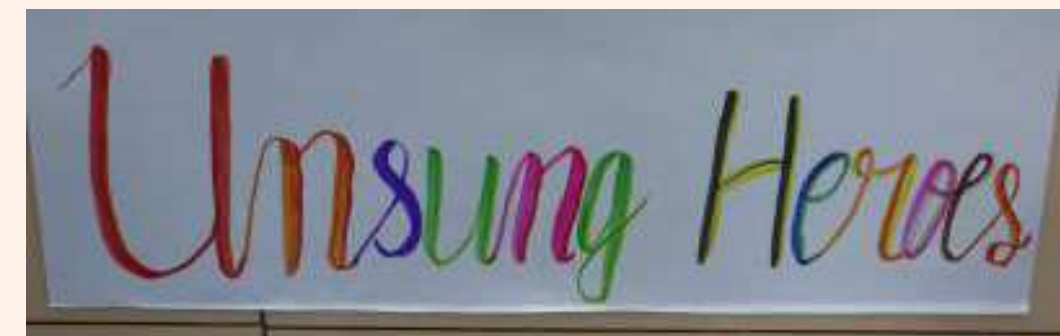

CCA under Tribal theme



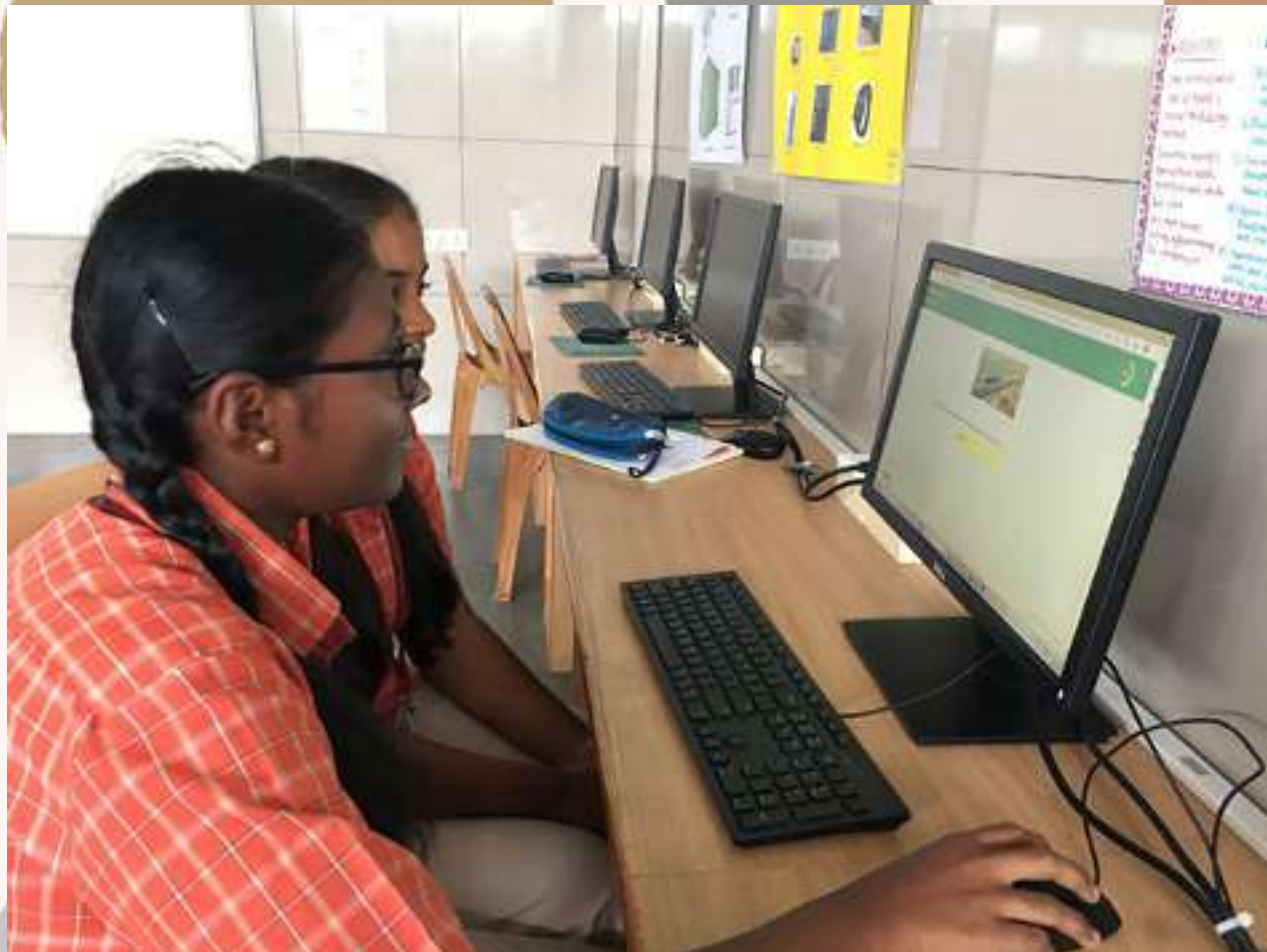

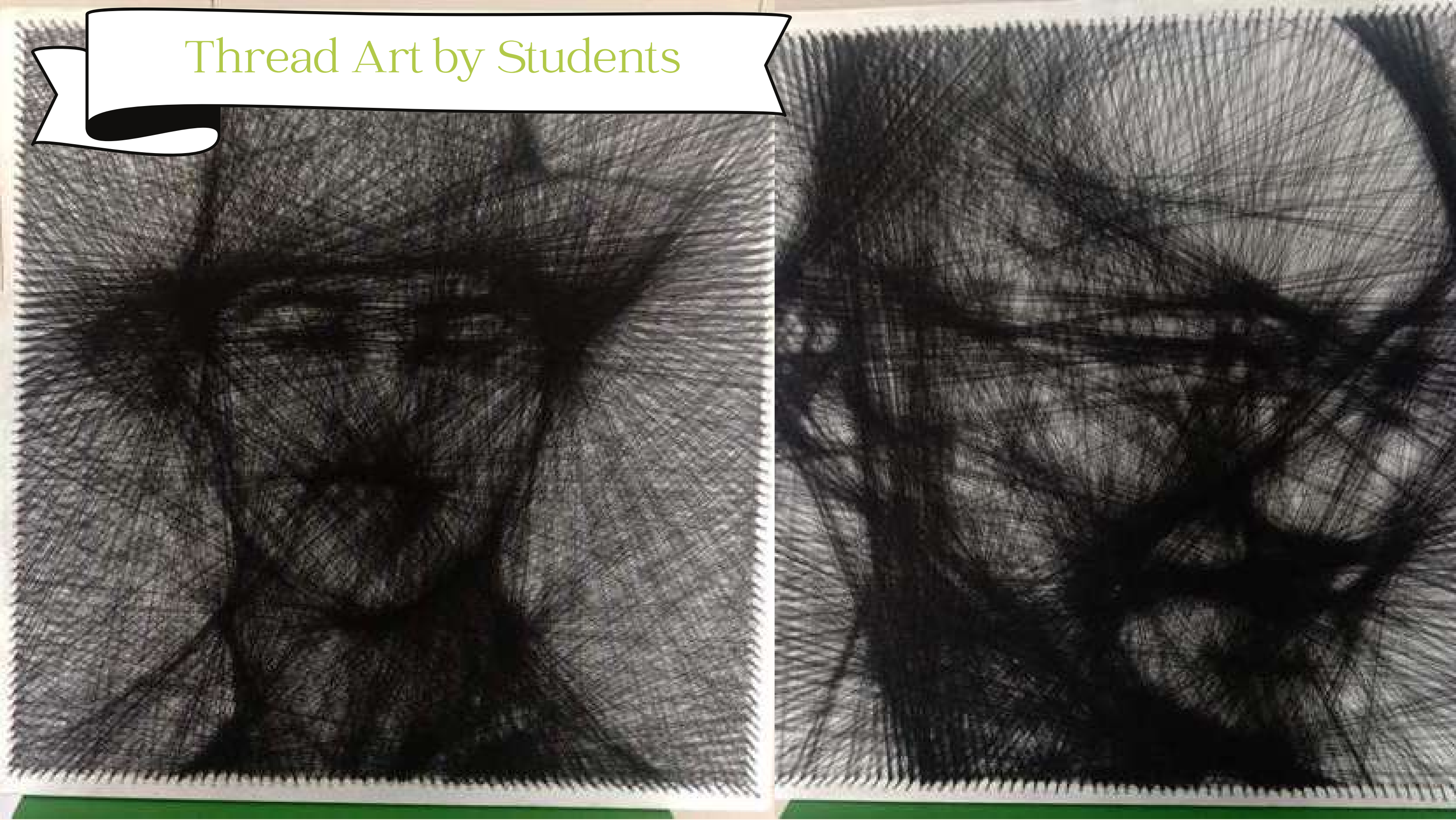

Robotics session by Kruthik Vijayakumar

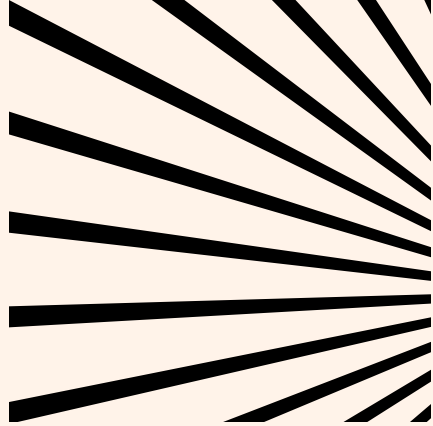

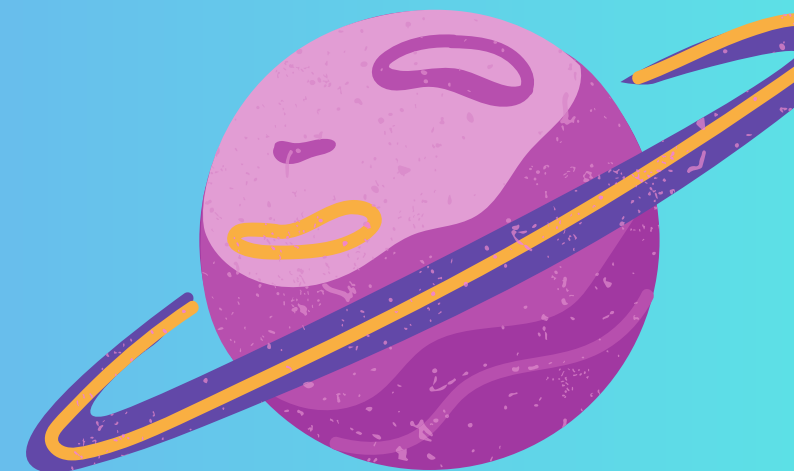
Students visit to Planetarium

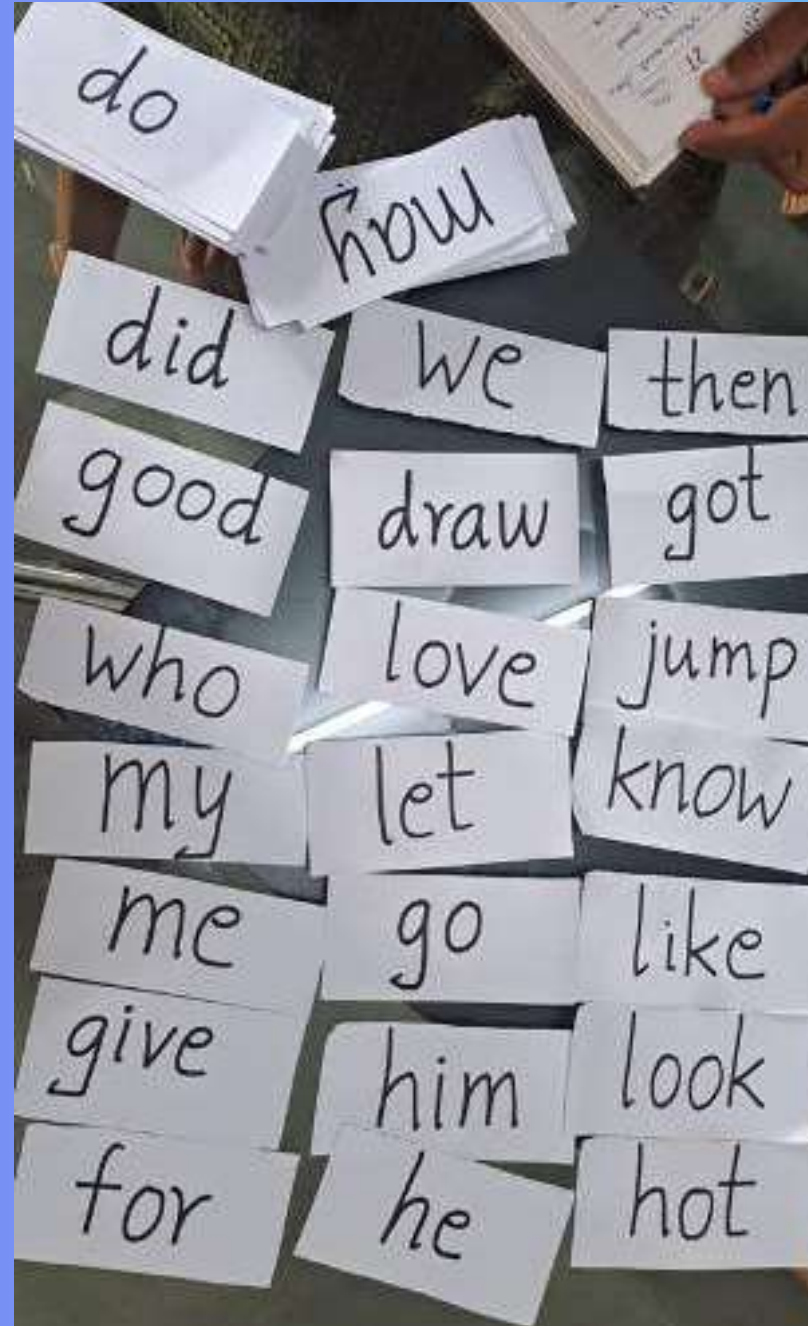

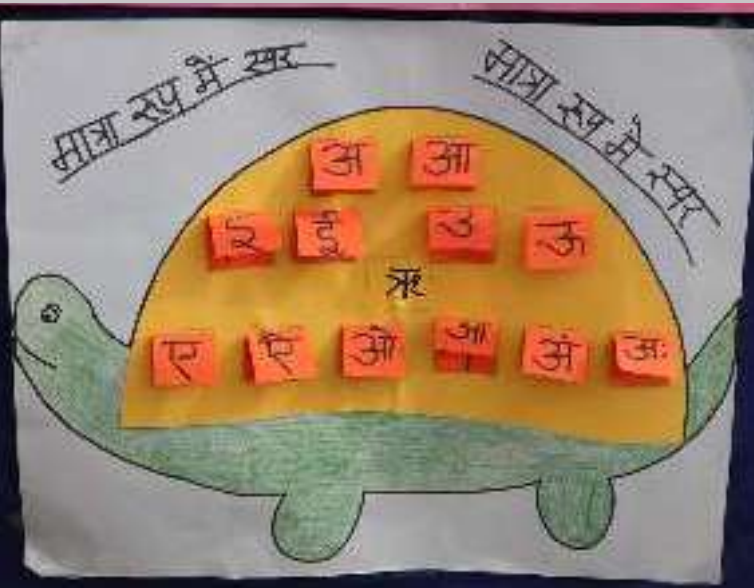

OPEN HOUSE



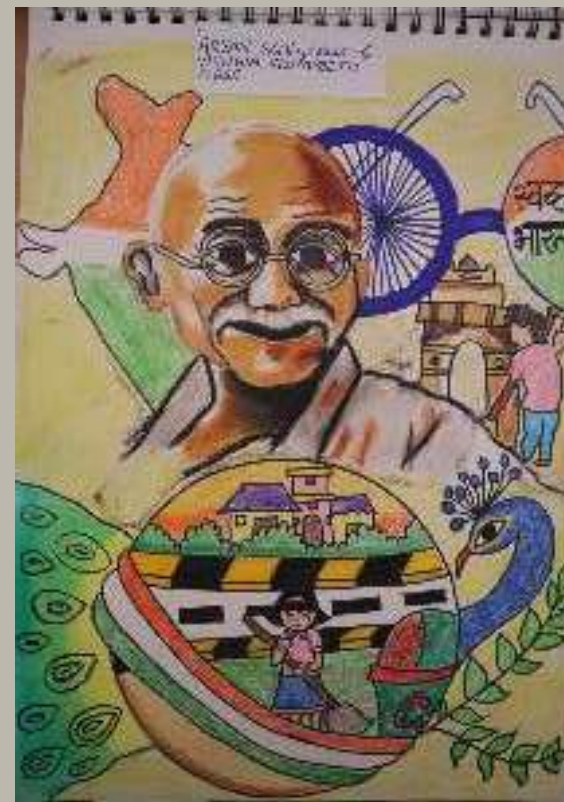

I am glad to share that my favourite leader is Narendra Modi.

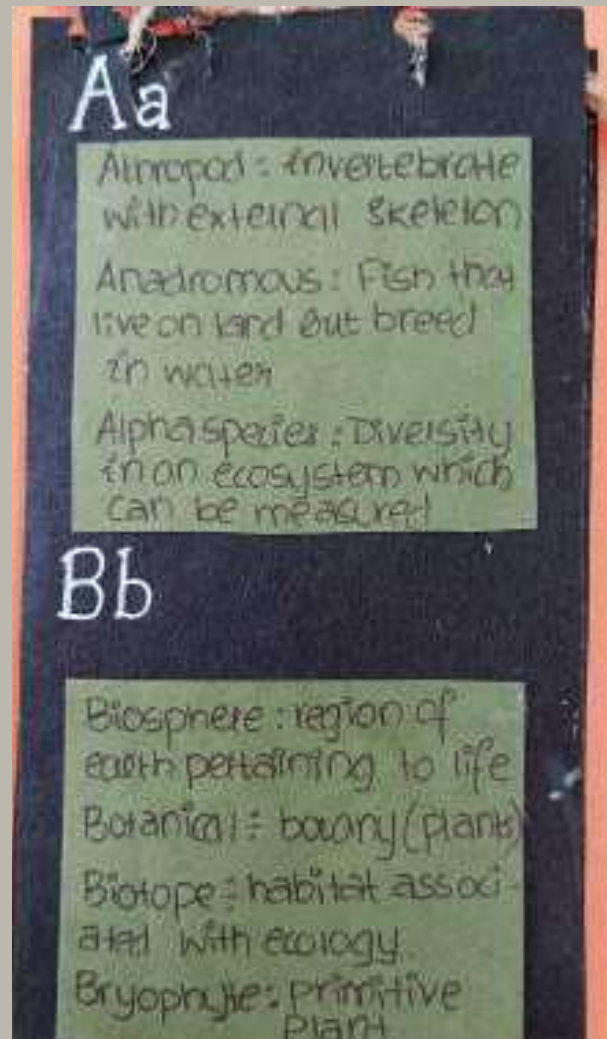

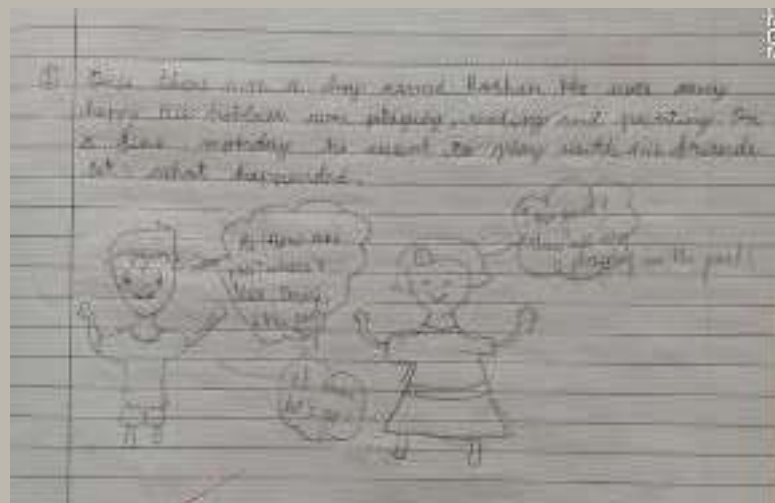
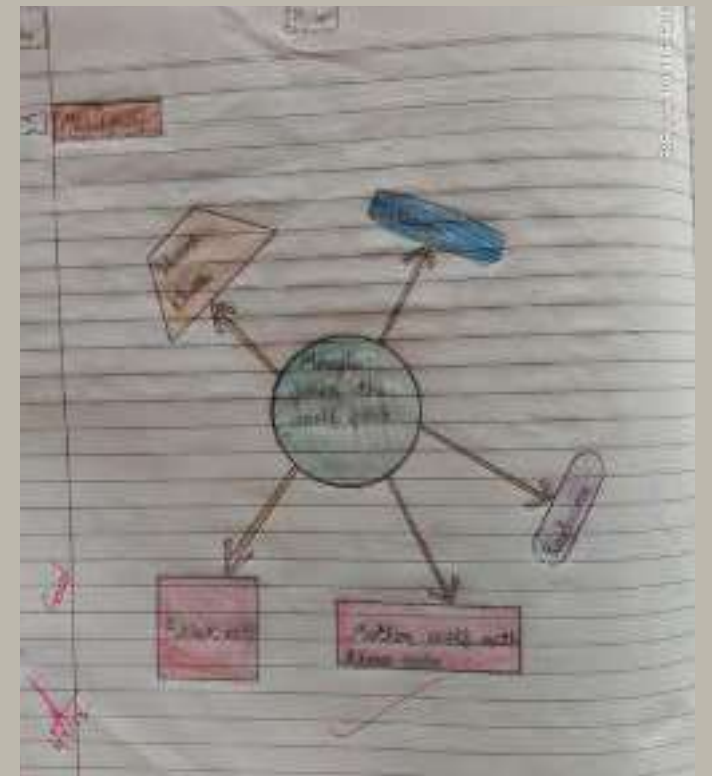

OUR FUTURE BEGINS TODAY.....

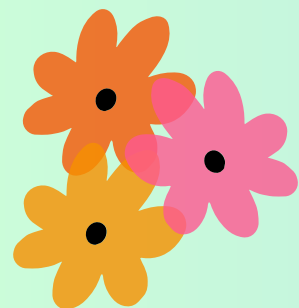
Yesterday was over yesterday.

Life is about the opportunities we can create in the future.

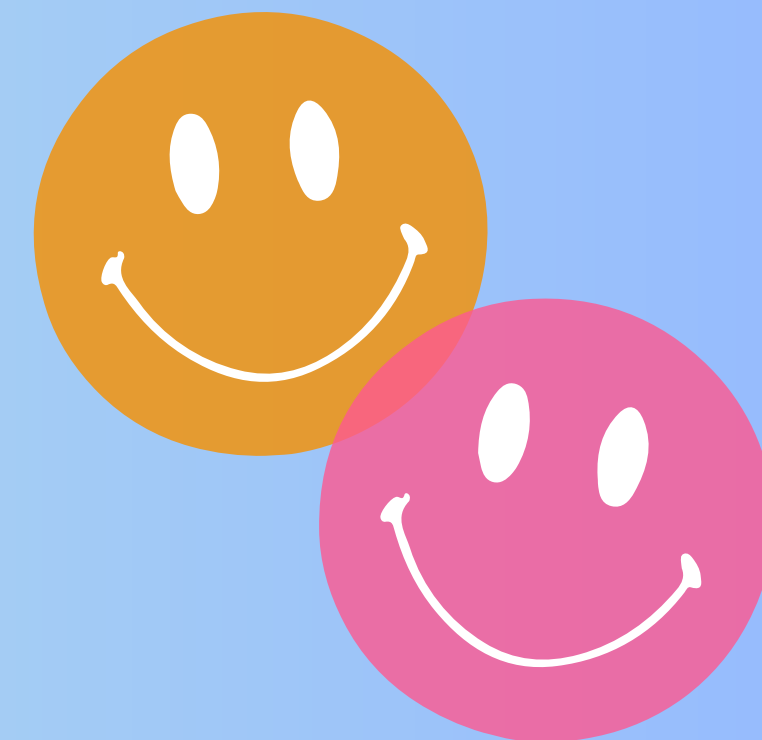
