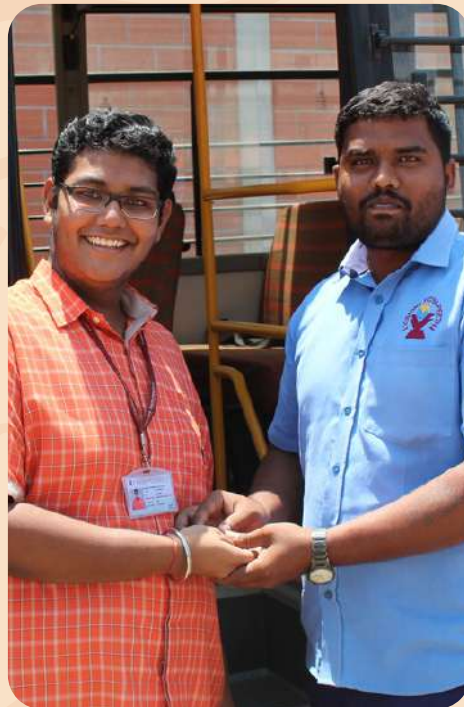


## Develop a clear vision and mission!

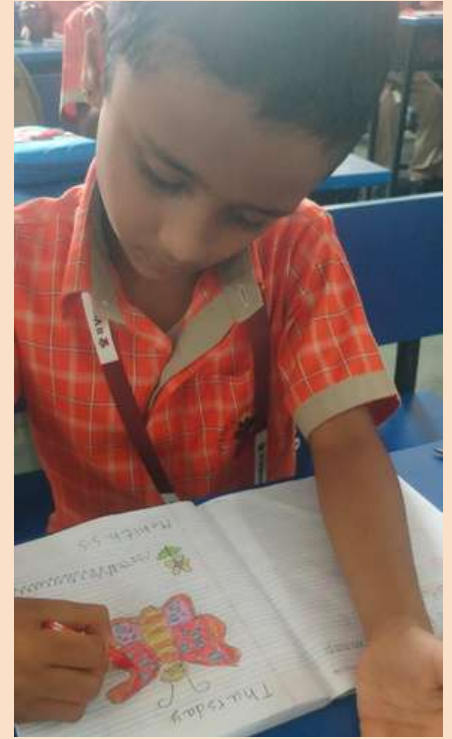

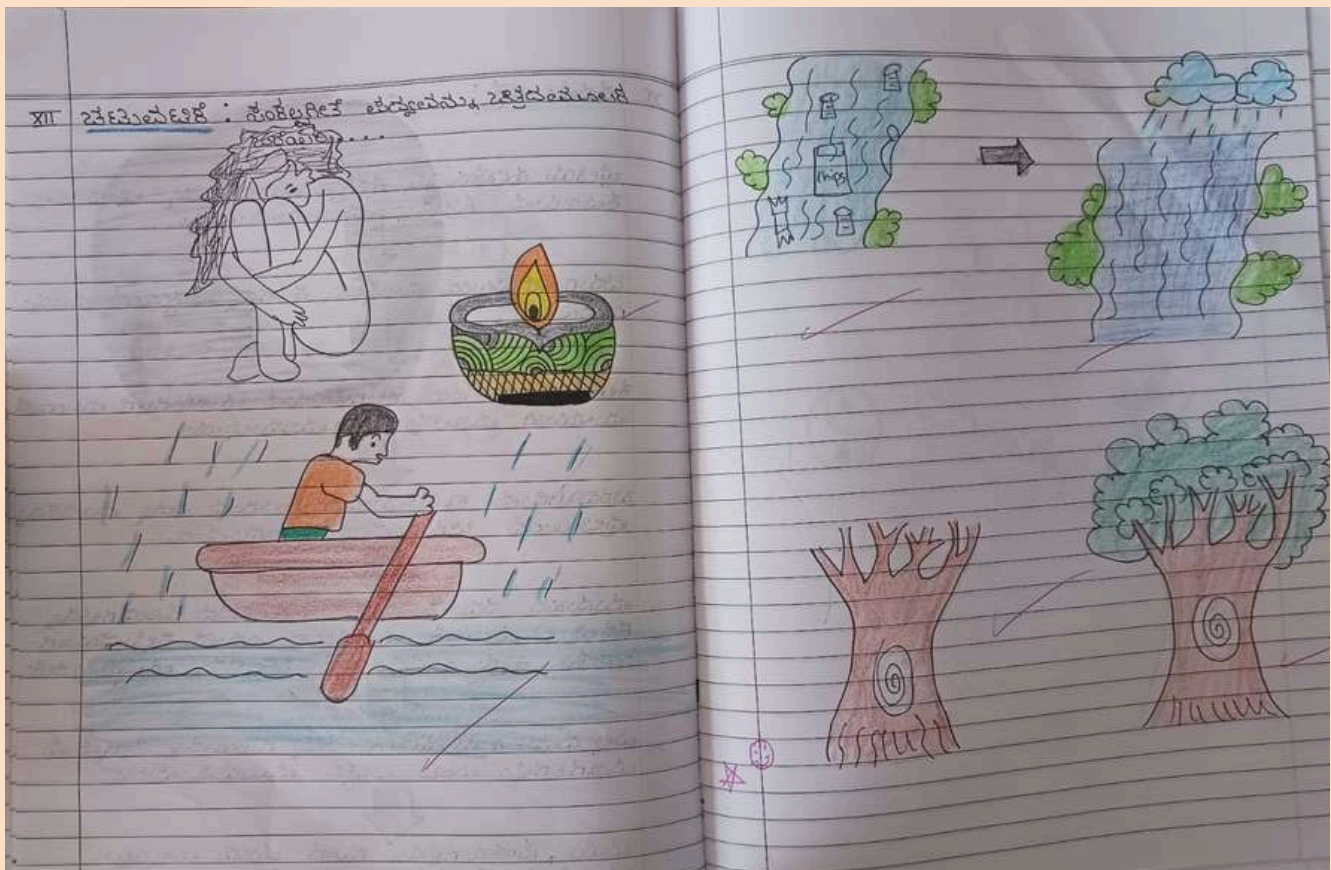
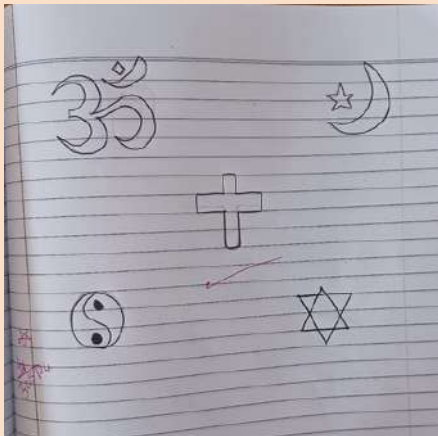
