In evaluating the academic performance of students in class 1 and 2, both oral and written cycle tests are essential tools. The written test started from 1st July 2024 to 10th July 25, 2024 and the oral test started from 15th July 2024 to 29th July 2024. It was focused on English, Math, EVS, kannada and hindi. Students showed good understanding of basic writing skills and they demonstrated good verbal communication skills and also high levels of enthusiasm and participation were noted. They showed commendable progress in understanding complex concepts and applying them effectively. Teachers reported overall satisfaction with the students' performance. They noted the importance of regular practice and encouraged students to continue their diligent efforts.

Counting and comparing-
How many more/less

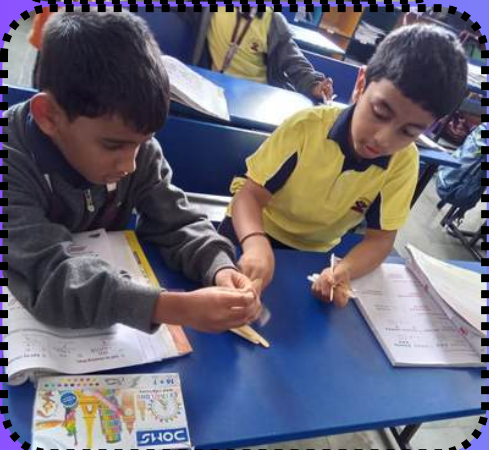
The students used the beads from the experiential learning kit to count the total number of beads they have and separating the beads with colour (all yellow beads, green beads, red beads and blue beads) and counting the number of beads in each colour and comparing which colour beads are more with them and which colour beads are less. Then comparing how many more beads are there when compared with the other coloured beads.

Regrouping tens

The students are using the tens and ones cards from the experiential learning kit. The students as a team did the activity on regrouping. First the students placed the number which was asked by the teacher Ex: 14 ones. Then the teacher asks the students to do a regrouping of 14 in which way should the number be regrouped and then the students start discussing with the team and arrange the numbers as 1 ten and 4 ones.

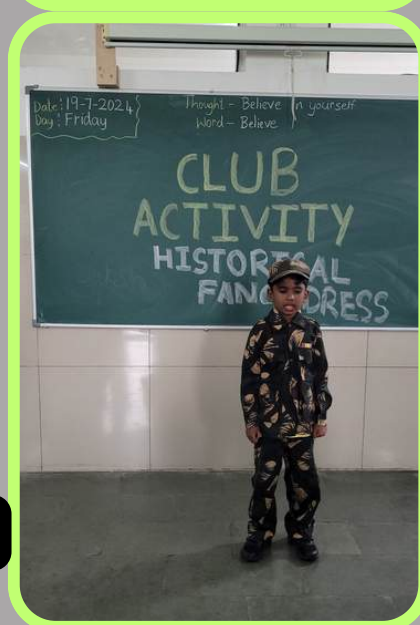

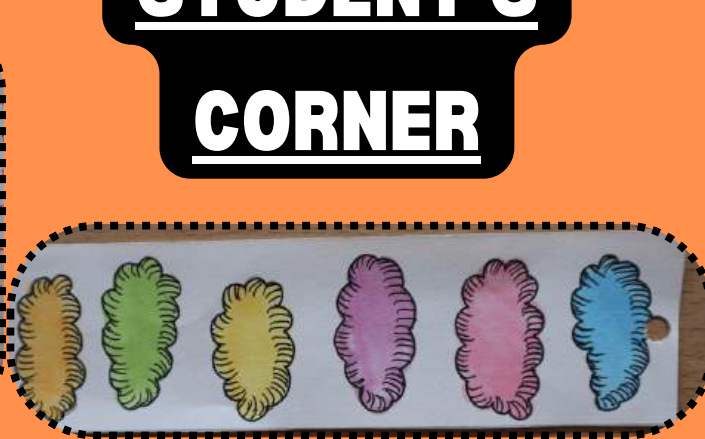

The little ones are getting introduced to the dynamics of group discussions already, to ponder, reflect and arrive at strategies to solve a given problem.

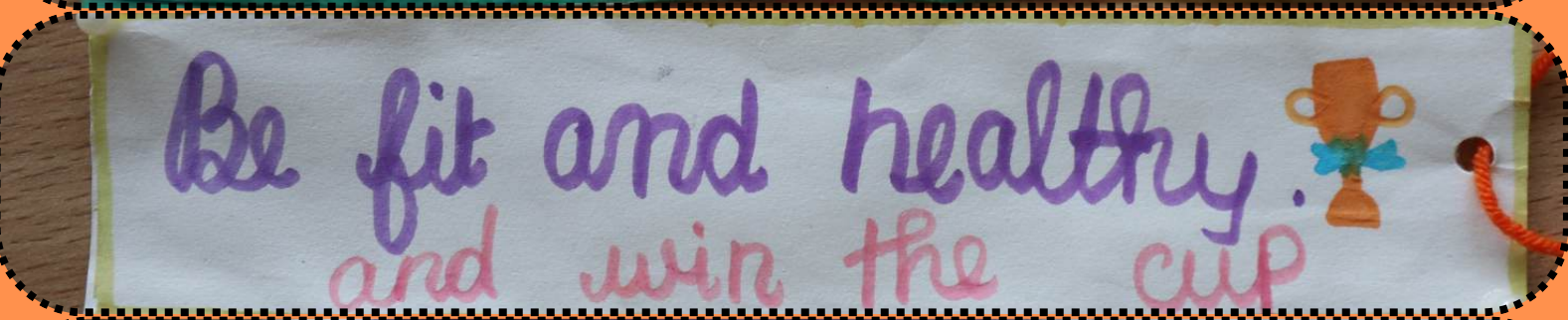
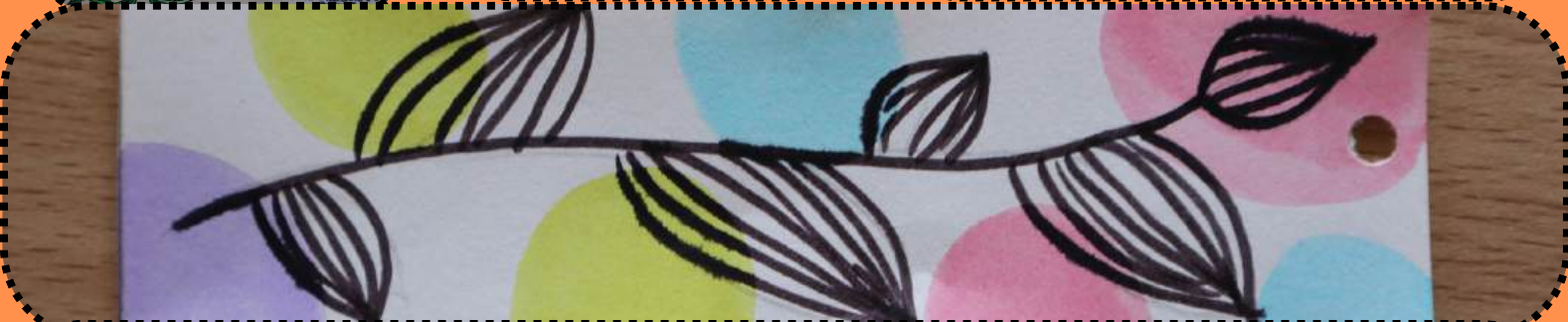


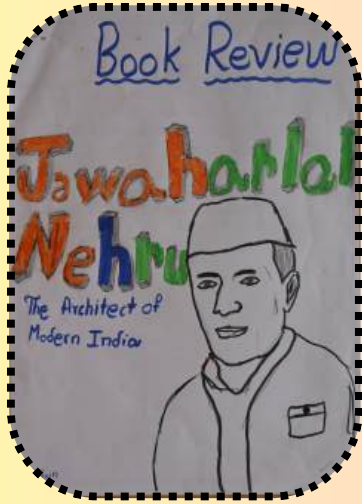
Club on Literary theme

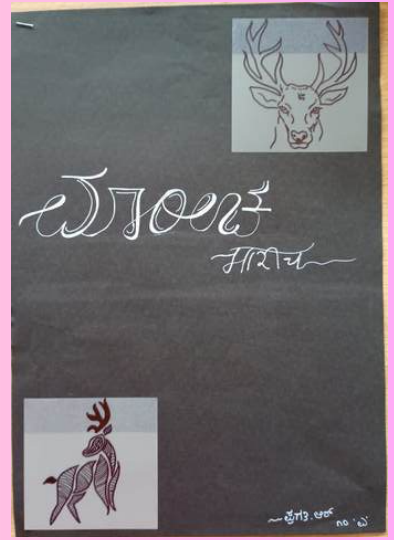
