1. Platform provided by VishwaVidyapeeth - Scope to explore on scientific temper:

Kartikeya of Class X and **Harini of Class VI** had exposure to insect olfaction-related work in Dr.Kesavan Subaharan's Veterinary Entomology laboratory, ICAR - National Bureau of Agricultural Insect Resources, Yelahanka campus, from April 24th to 28th 2023. During their internship program, students spent time culturing insects for experiments, Identifying various bio stages of insects, and Identifying compounds that are toxic to insects.

Similarly, **Hithesh Karnam of Class X** and **Harshika Adapala of Class X** took part in the Summer School of Practical Electronics, organized by the Electronics and Engineering group of Raman Research Institute, Bangalore, from 19th April to 19th May 2023. In practical sessions students learned about semiconductors, making PCB, to construct different types of circuits with PCBs and Breadboards. They were also exposed to simple projects in Arduino.

22. Pottery
