

Heritage trip class VII - Pondicherry

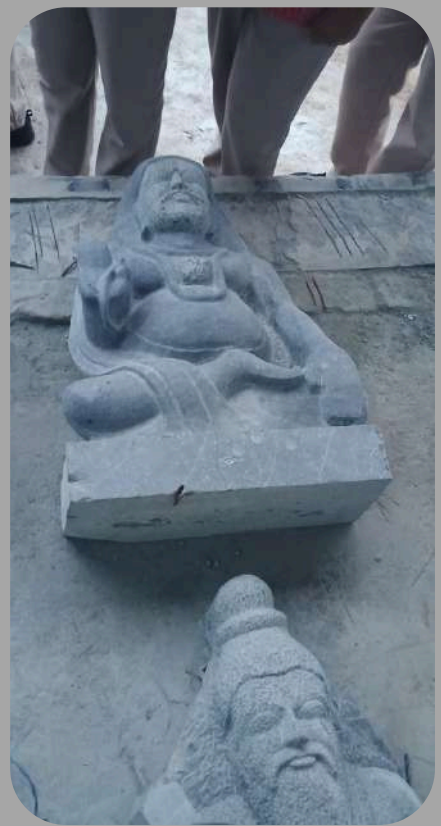

The divine visit to Chandramouleeshwarar and Manakula Vinayagar temple, both constructed in tamilian style of architecture with illustrious history gave a deeper understanding of "The Cholas, their temples and bronze sculptures" as mentioned in Class VII Social Studies Chapter 2- Kings and Kingdoms.

In an endeavour to explore the rich heritage of the Chola dynasty, the students of class VIII took off on a two-days tour to Tanjore in Tamil Nadu from 8th August to 10th August, 2024

Students visited the Brihadeeswarar Temple also known as The Big Temple, a UNESCO World Heritage site known for its architectural grandeur and massive Shiva linga. After exploring its intricate sculptures, they went to the Thanjavur Art Village to see traditional bronze sculpture-making. Further, they toured the Maratha Palace, now a school, and the Royal Palace Museum, which houses royal artifacts and the Saraswathi Mahal library's extensive manuscript collection. They then visited the Rockfort Ganesh Temple in Tiruchirappalli renowned for the lord atop a 275 ft. smooth rock structure. The team then headed to Srirangam Ranganathaswamy temple, a place with the unique distinction of being the foremost among the 108 Divya Desams dedicated to the god Vishnu, located on an islet between the Cauvery and Coleroon rivers. They then travelled to Gangaikonda Cholapuram, yet another UNESCO World heritage site that houses the Mahashaiva temple, admired for its magnificent Chola architecture.

The tour provided a rich experience of historical and cultural heritage, highlighting India's architectural and artistic achievements.

Students and teachers of class IX embarked on an educational trip to Hampi. They visited the Prehistoric Museum, explored the Tungabhadra Dam, and enjoyed the musical fountain. The day also included visits to the Queen's Bath, Lotus Palace, and the Elephant and Horse area, with a detailed exploration of historical structures and artifacts. The trip was highly educational, with students actively engaging and learning about history and heritage. The visit was both informative and interactive, fostering a deeper understanding of our cultural heritage.

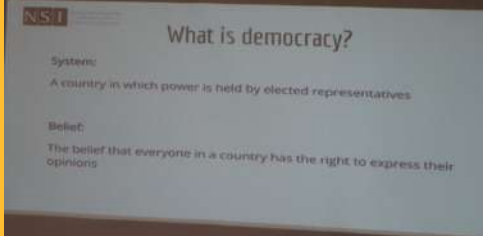


KARGIL DIWAS
