Heritage trip class VII - Pondicherry













Chandramouleeshwarar and Manakula Vinayagar temple, both constructed in tamilian style of architecture with illustrious history gave a deeper understanding of "The Cholas, their temples and bronze sculptures" as mentioned in Class VII Social Studies Chapter 2-Kings and Kingdoms.







On 31st August 2024, Class 10 students visited Kolar, exploring historic temples like Kolaramma,

Someshwara, Sharada Devi, and Ramalingeshwara, each showcasing unique architecture and religious significance.

They also toured a village sculpting factory, observing traditional stonecarving techniques. The

trip offered a rich insight into Kolar's cultural heritage.

























In an endeavour to explore the rich heritage of the Chola dynasty, the students of class VIII took off on a two-days tour to Tanjore in Tamil Nadu from 8th August to 10th August, 2024

Students visited the Brihadeeswarar Temple also known as The Big Temple, a UNESCO Heritage site known for World architectural grandeur and massive Shiva After exploring its intricate sculptures, they went to the Thanjavur Art Village to see traditional bronze sculpturemaking. Further, they toured the Maratha Palace, now a school, and the Royal Palace Museum, which houses royal artifacts and the Saraswathi Mahal library's extensive manuscript collection. They then visited the Rockfort Ganesh Temple in Tiruchirappalli renowned for the lord atop a 275 ft. smooth rock structure. The team then headed to Srirangam Ranganathaswamy temple, a place with the unique distinction of being the foremost among the IO8 Divya Desams dedicated to the god Vishnu, located on an islet between the Cauvery and Coleroon rivers. They then travelled to Gangaikonda Cholapuram, yet another UNESCO World heritage site that houses the Mahashiva temple, admired for its magnificent Chola architecture.

The tour provided a rich experience of historical and cultural heritage, highlighting India's architectural and artistic achievements.



Students and teachers of class IX embarked on an educational trip to Hampi. They visited the Prehistoric Museum, explored the Tungabhadra Dam, and enjoyed the musical fountain. They had the chance to visit the Virupaksha Temple, Ganesha Statue, Kalyani and also the various other remnants of the Vijayanagara Empire. The day also included visits to the Queen's Bath, Lotus Palace, and the Elephant and Horse area, with a detailed exploration of historical structures and artifacts. The Vitthala Temple, where students learned about the Ramayana carvings and the Stone Chariot gave them rich insights about the Vijayanagar dynasty. The trip was highly educational, with students actively engaging and learning about history and heritage. They demonstrated excellent behavior and teamwork, appreciating the insightful experience and the quality of the food and arrangements made by the tour operator. The visit was both informative and interactive, fostering a deeper understanding of our cultural heritage.


