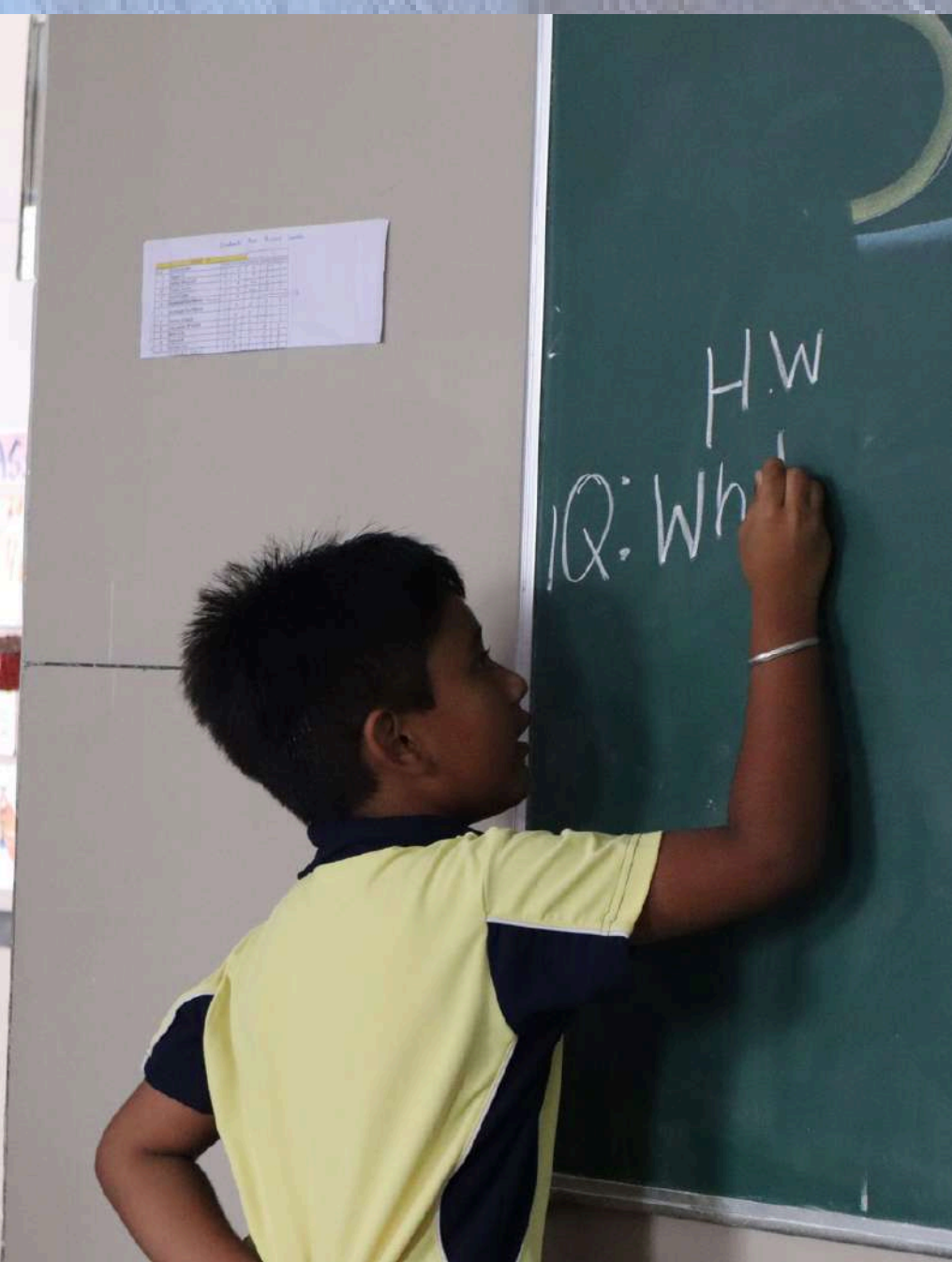
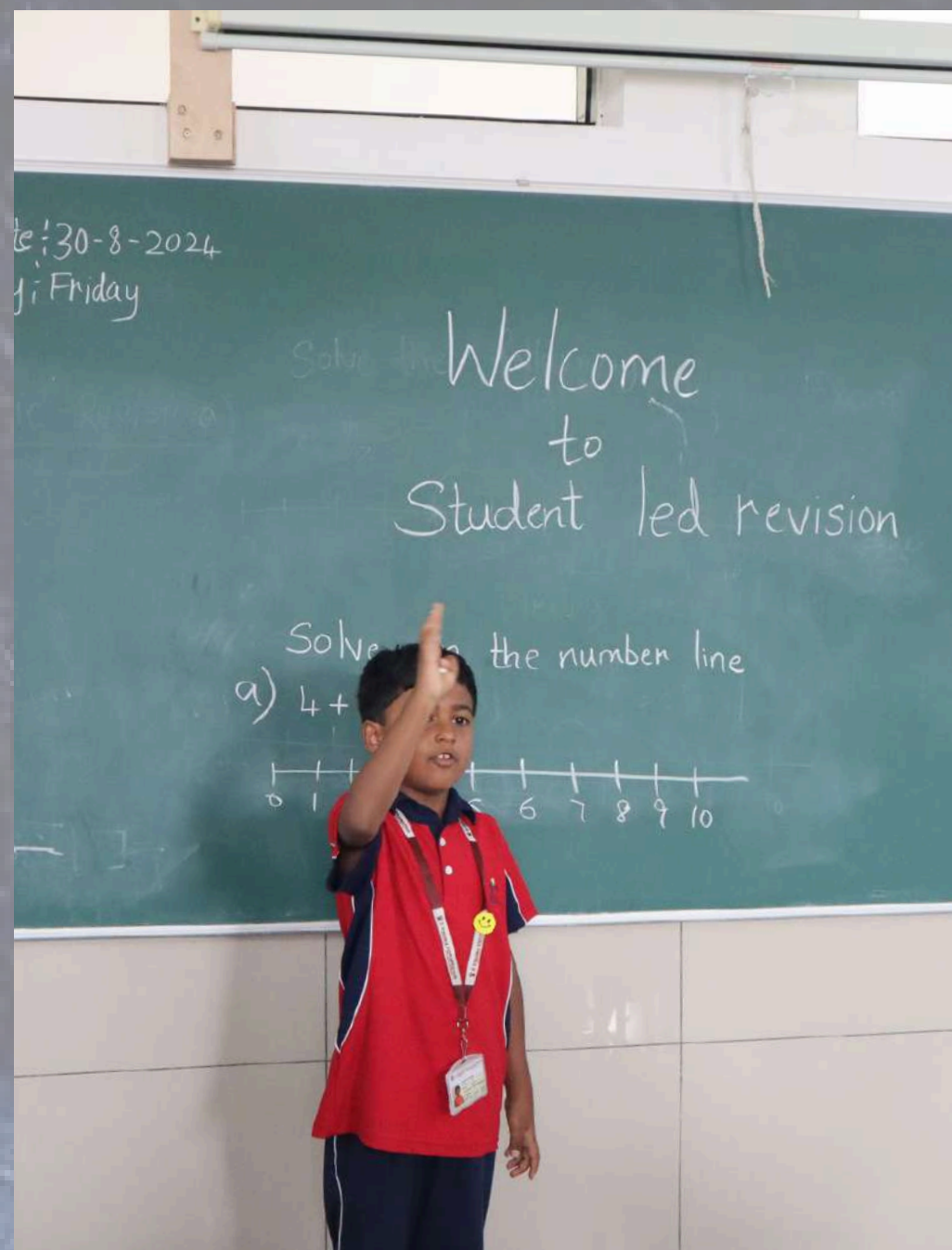
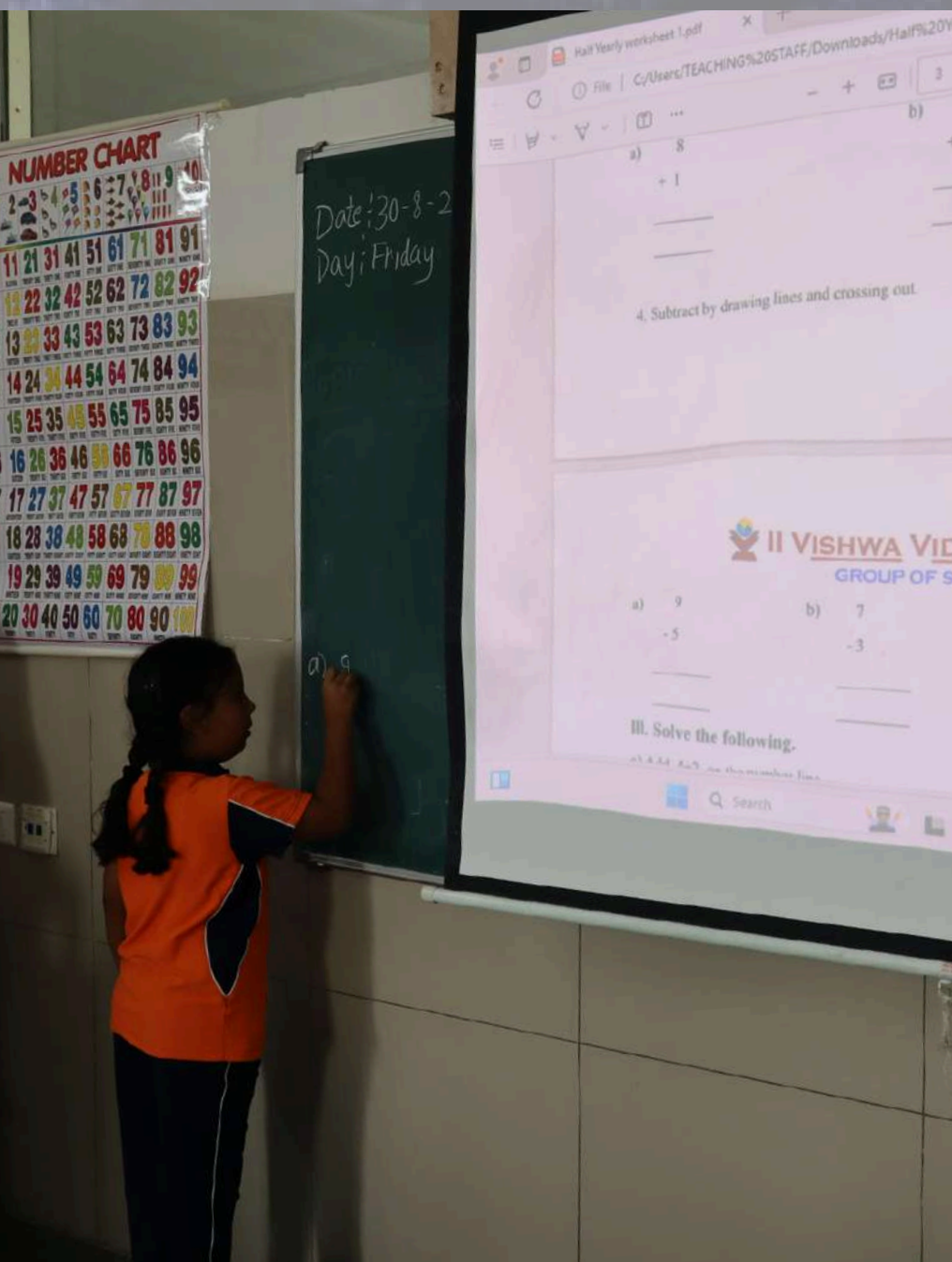


"Play hard, dream big - it's not about winning, it's about having fun."

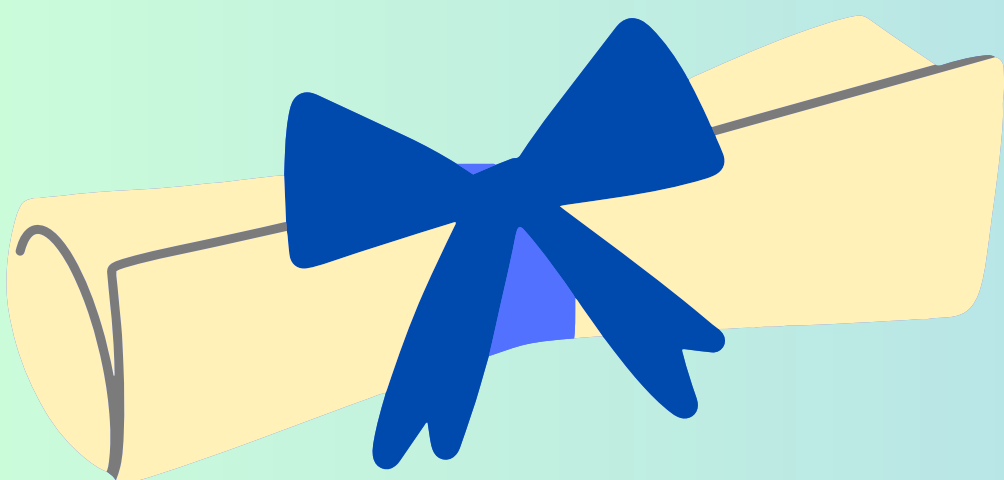

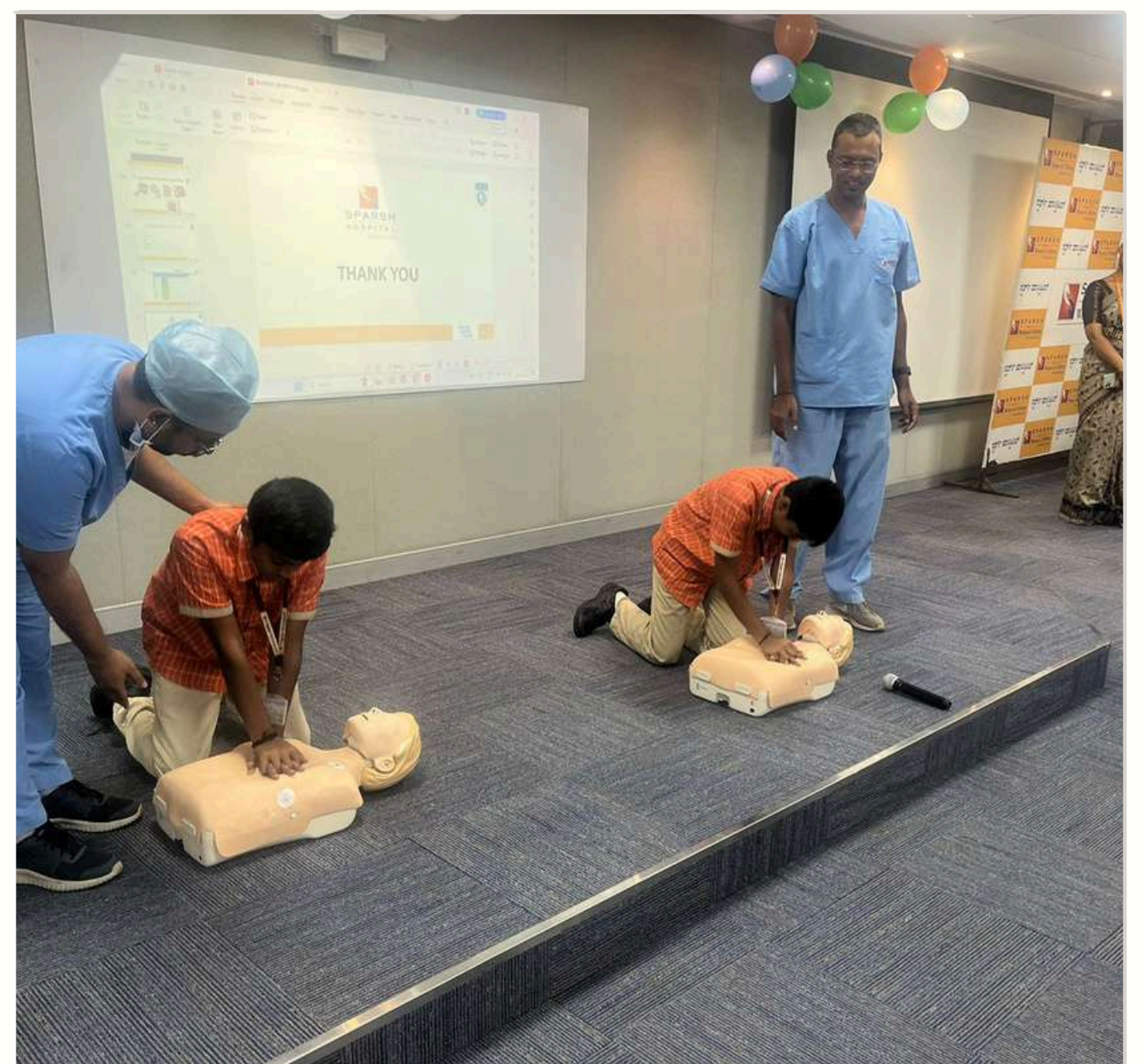

DURING THE VISIT, STUDENTS LEARNED HOW TO EFFECTIVELY CONDUCT INTERVIEWS, MAKE OBJECTIVE OBSERVATIONS, AND ADMINISTER PSYCHOLOGICAL TESTS FOR THE COLLECTION OF DATA IN THE DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT OF PSYCHOLOGICAL DISORDERS. 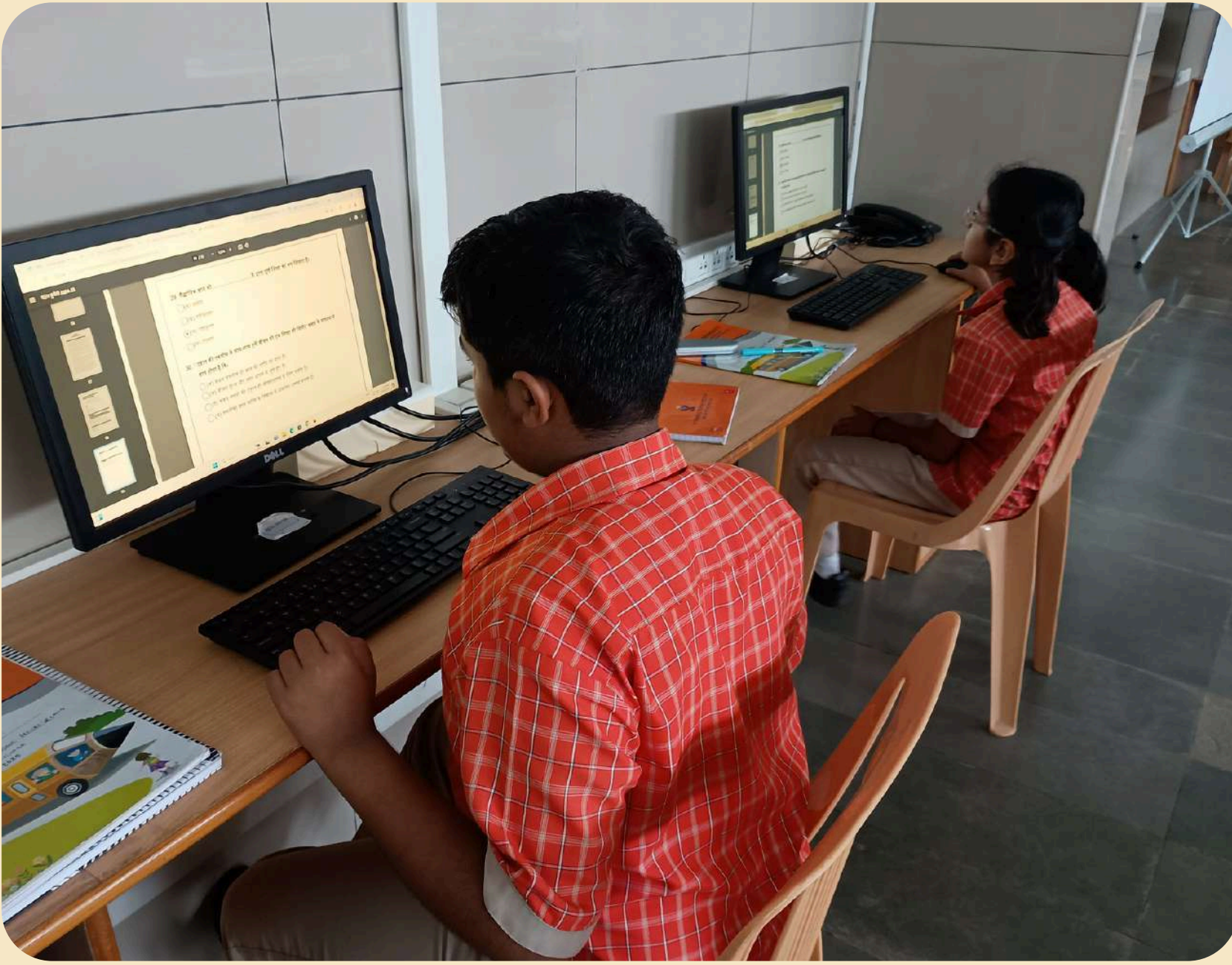

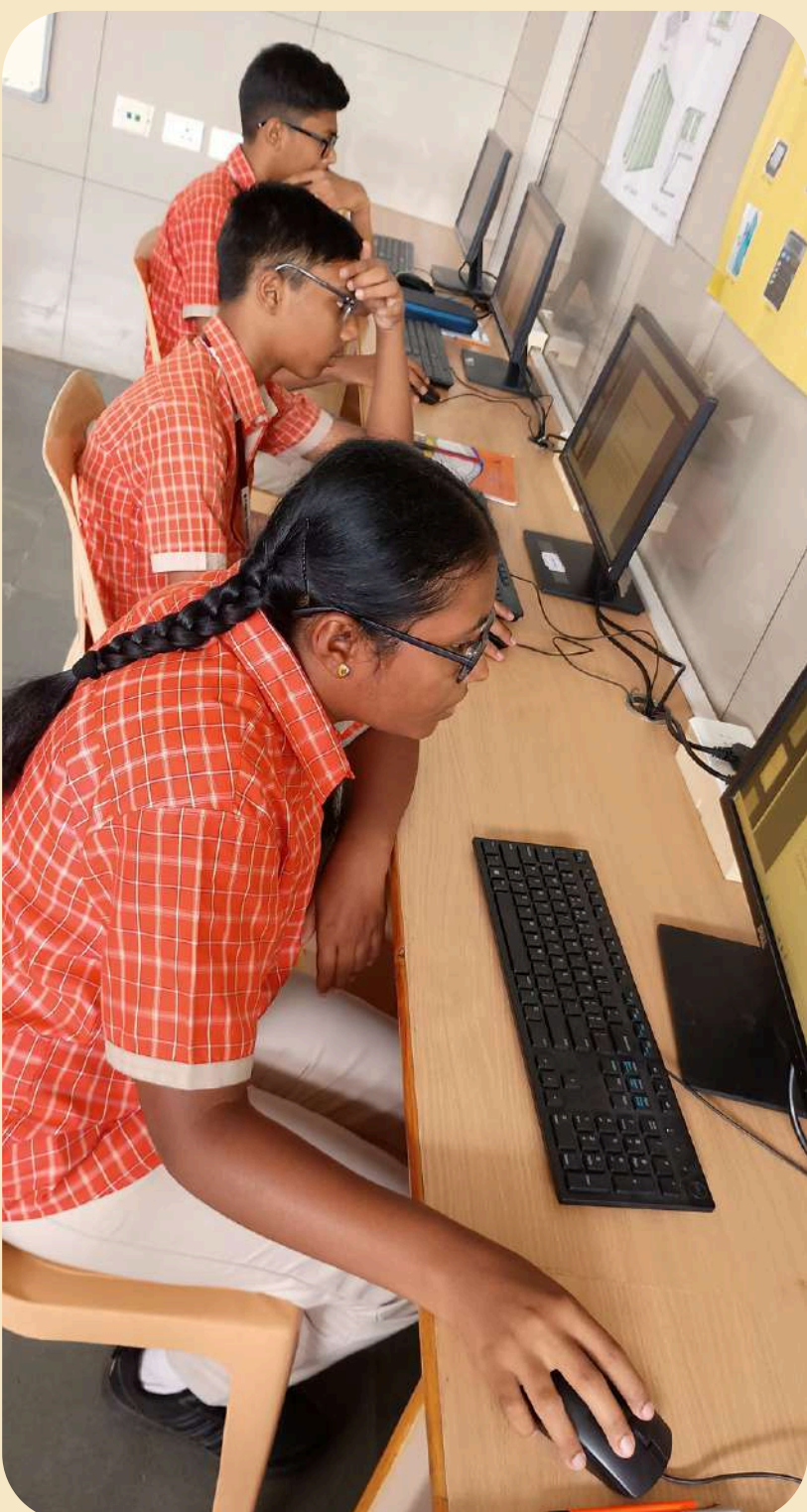

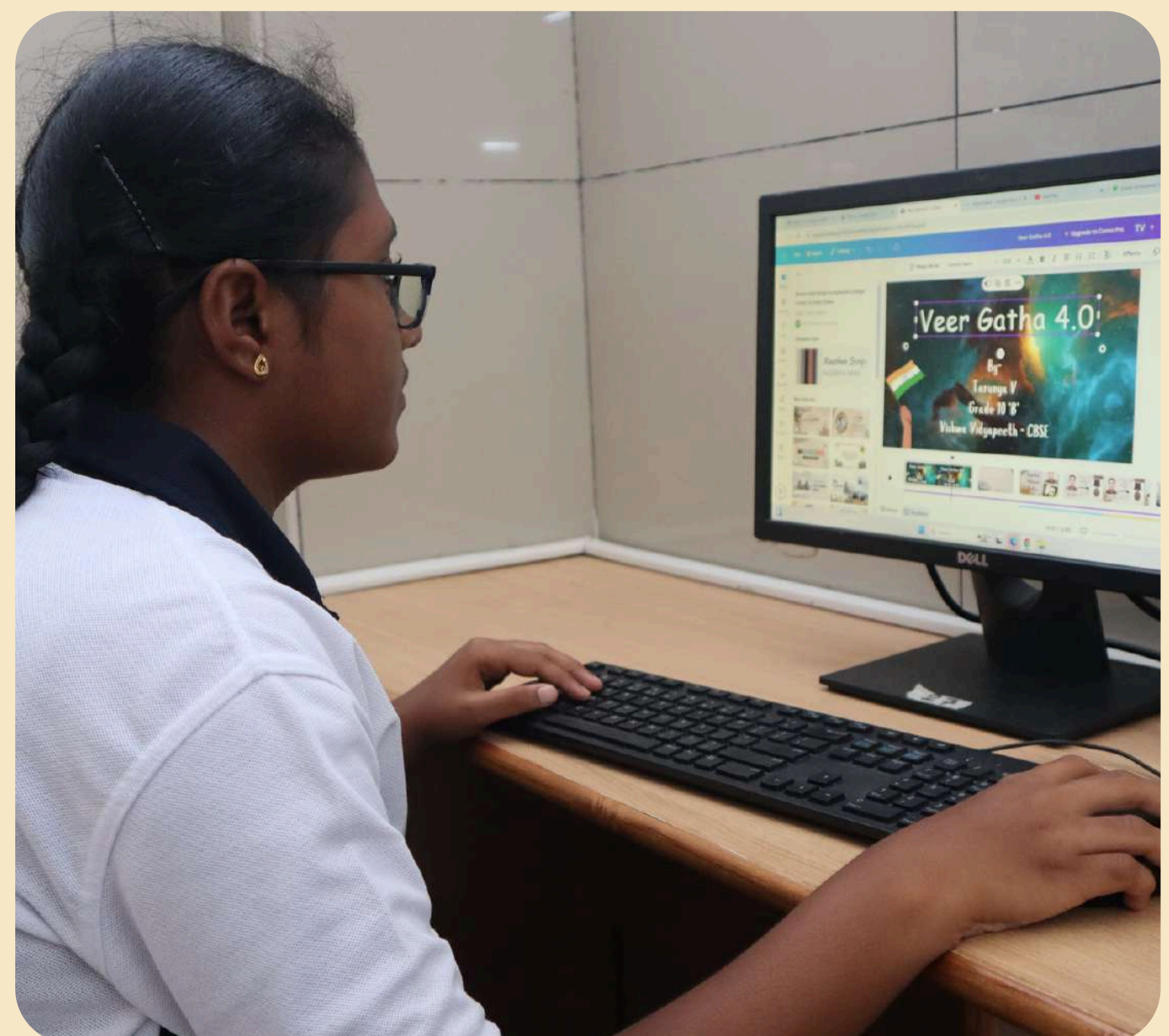
The Reading Challenge in English and Hindi aims to encourage participants to expand their literary horizons, improve their language skills, and cultivate a love for reading in both languages. Through

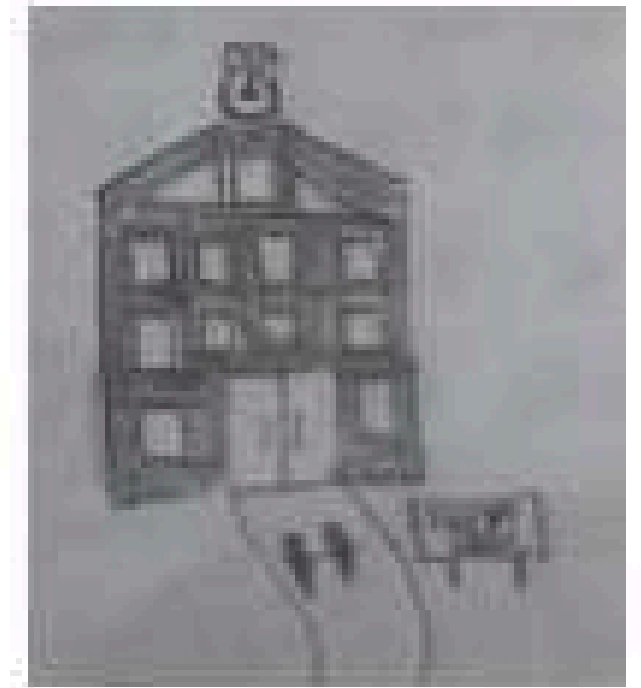

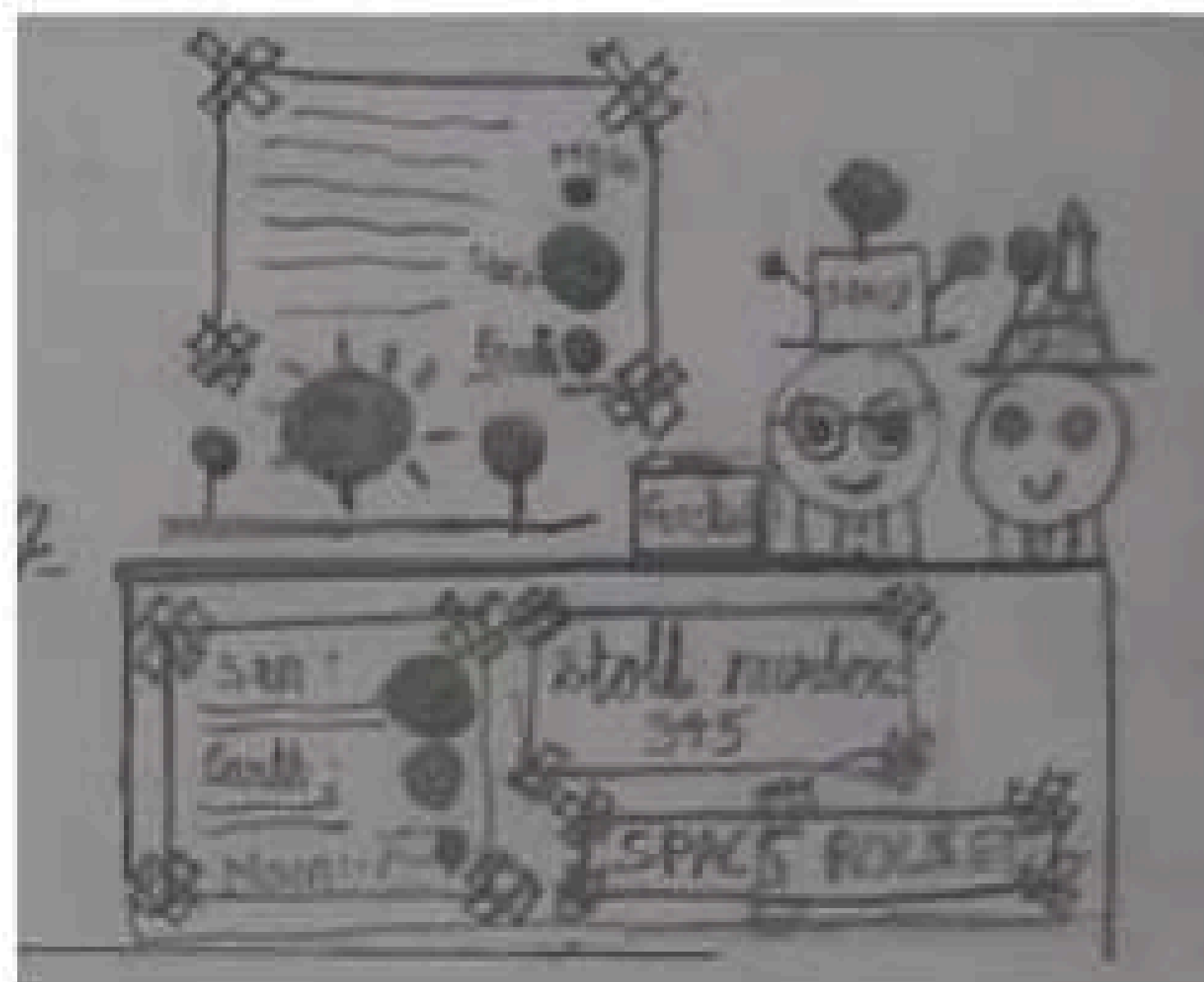
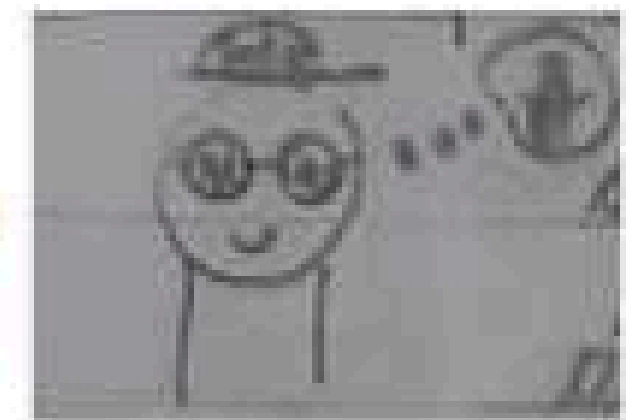
