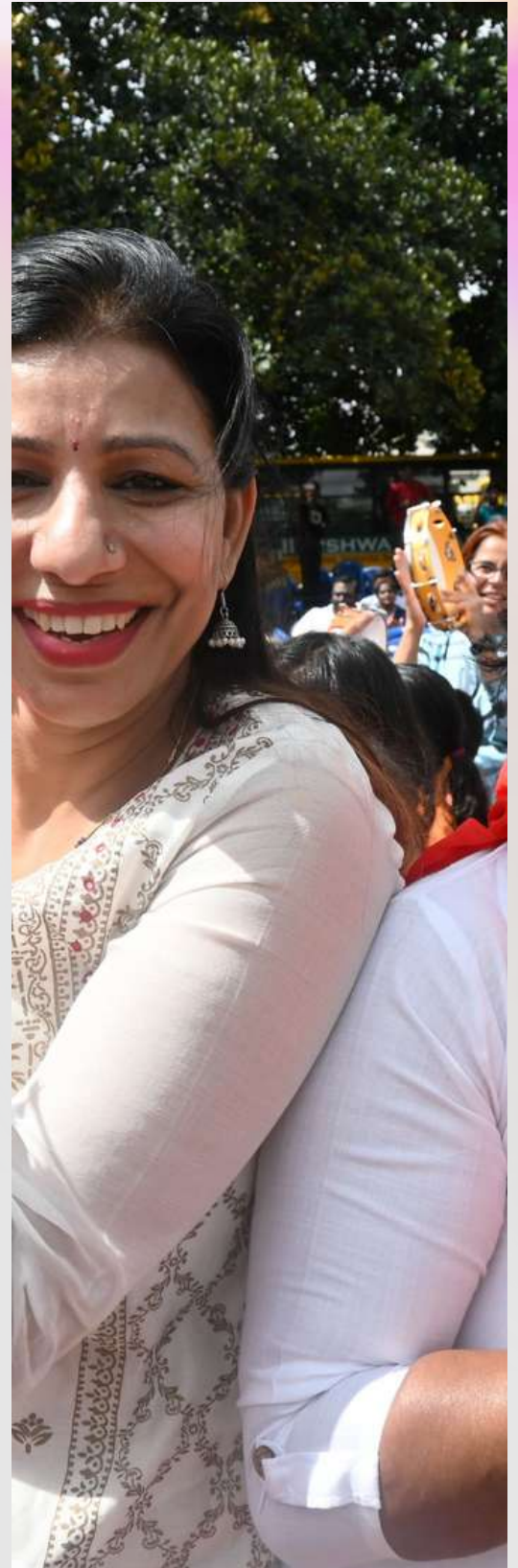
Sai Kumar-:
