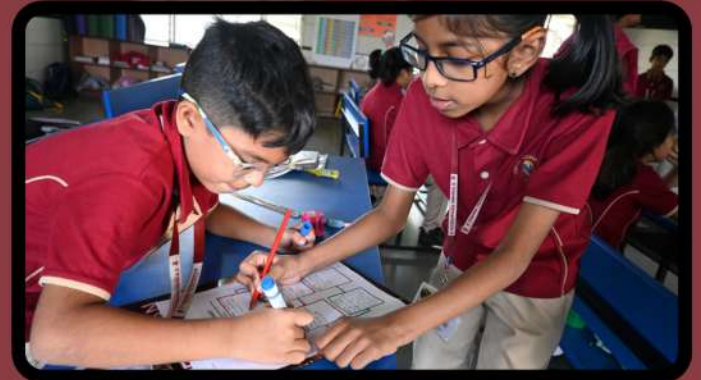

ANOTHER BEGINNING

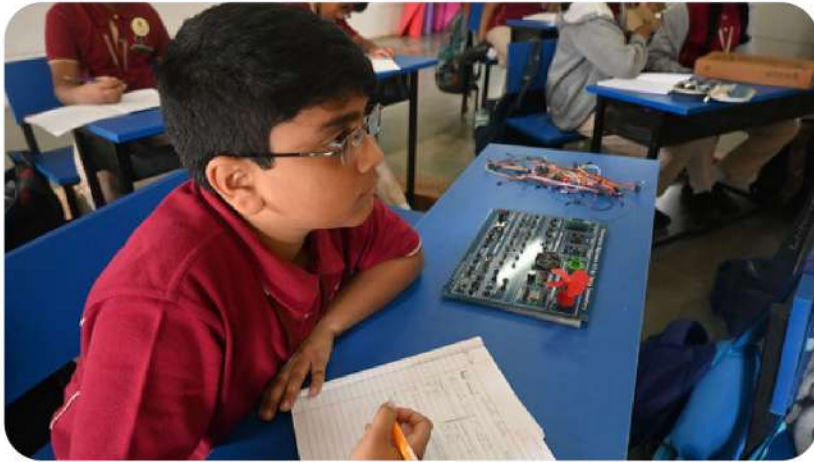
